Horizon Europe is the new EU flagship programme (€95.5 billion) for research and innovation. A significant part of the funding will be targeted towards green and digital transitions for our societies and a sustainable recovery from the global crisis that has emerged following the covid-19 pandemic. Of interest to early and mid-career researchers, the funding will support fellowships, training and exchanges for researchers through Marie Skłodowska-Curie Actions, and funding for frontier research through the European Research Council.
